Project Lifesaver equips and trains law enforcement agencies in an active response system to help with the increasing problem of locating wandering patients before they fall victim to the elements, accidents or predators.

Rugged, Canadian made FM **directional receivers**, proven technology that is able to track through obstacles, penetrates through concrete walls and heavy forest. Secure, battery powered, water resistant radio transmitters emitting a frequency that is tracked on the ground or in the air over several miles.



A search is activated when caregivers call 911 to notify that their loved one is missing, a specially trained search and rescue team responds to the wanderer's area and starts searching with a mobile locator tracking system. Search times have been reduced from hours and days to minutes.

Clients who are a part of Project Lifesaver program wear a personalized bracelet. It is a one-ounce battery operated radio wrist transmitter emitting a unique automatic tracking signal every second, 24 hours a day. Battery provides a continuous signal for up to 45 days, however it is changed every 30 days.
